Parliamentary Standing committee Meeting on Urban Development on implementation of street Vending Act 2014, Chaired By Sri Jagdambika Pal.

NASVI appealed strongly for effective implementation of Street Vendors Act 2014 and pointed out the progressive features of the Act which doesn't exist in any other part of the world.

The Parliamentary Standing Committee ,thereafter, made detailed recommendations for smooth implementation of the Act

Dear friends,

The last two years have been very tumultuous for us - lockdowns, gradual opening of markets with unreasonable restrictions, competition from online companies, interference in street vending in the form of evictions and police harassment etc.

We also saw steps like notification of rules and schemes of all the states/UTs, distribution of 30 lakh Certificates of Vending (COVs), first ever direct credit scheme for street vendors - PM Svanidhi that benefitted over 30 lakh vendors, Svanidhi se Samridhi, issuance of necessary circulars to State Governments etc. More than 4000 TVCs have been constituted but the speed of creation of vending zones has been extremely slow. All this have resulted in a very quaint situation. Street vendors are perplexed.

On one side, Hon'ble PM is pushing for PM-Svanidhi, digital payment and on the other hand Municipal bodies are evicting and imposing penalty on the vendors with COVs. But wherever there is strong organisation, vendors are able to manage. So the answer my friend is blowing in the wind, as John Denver says. The answer is strong organisation to make use of opportunities and thwart harassment & evictions.

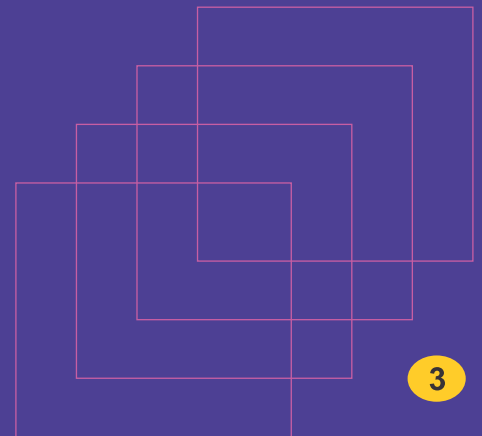
Our Mission

Two decades ago NASVI embarked on a journey to ascertain livelihood security for the vendors of the country. After years of struggle, astute advocacy and resilience of the members, Government of India passed the Street Vendors Act in the year 2014.

The Street Vendors Act 2014

Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014 is an Act passed by the Parliament of India enacted to regulate street vending and protect the rights of the vendors. The Street Vendors Act 2014 aims to protect the livelihood of street vendors by providing them a conducive environment to carry on their business without fear of harassment, eviction or extortion from police and municipal officials. At the same time, it is meant to regulate the activity of street vending for the management of public spaces and traffic.

1. Town Vending Committee (TVC) comprises of 40% elected street vendors.

2. Local Authorities to act only on the recommendations of the TVC.

3. Survey at least once in very five years of all the existing vendors.

4. Surveyed vendors to be issued a certificate of vending and pay monthly vending fee.

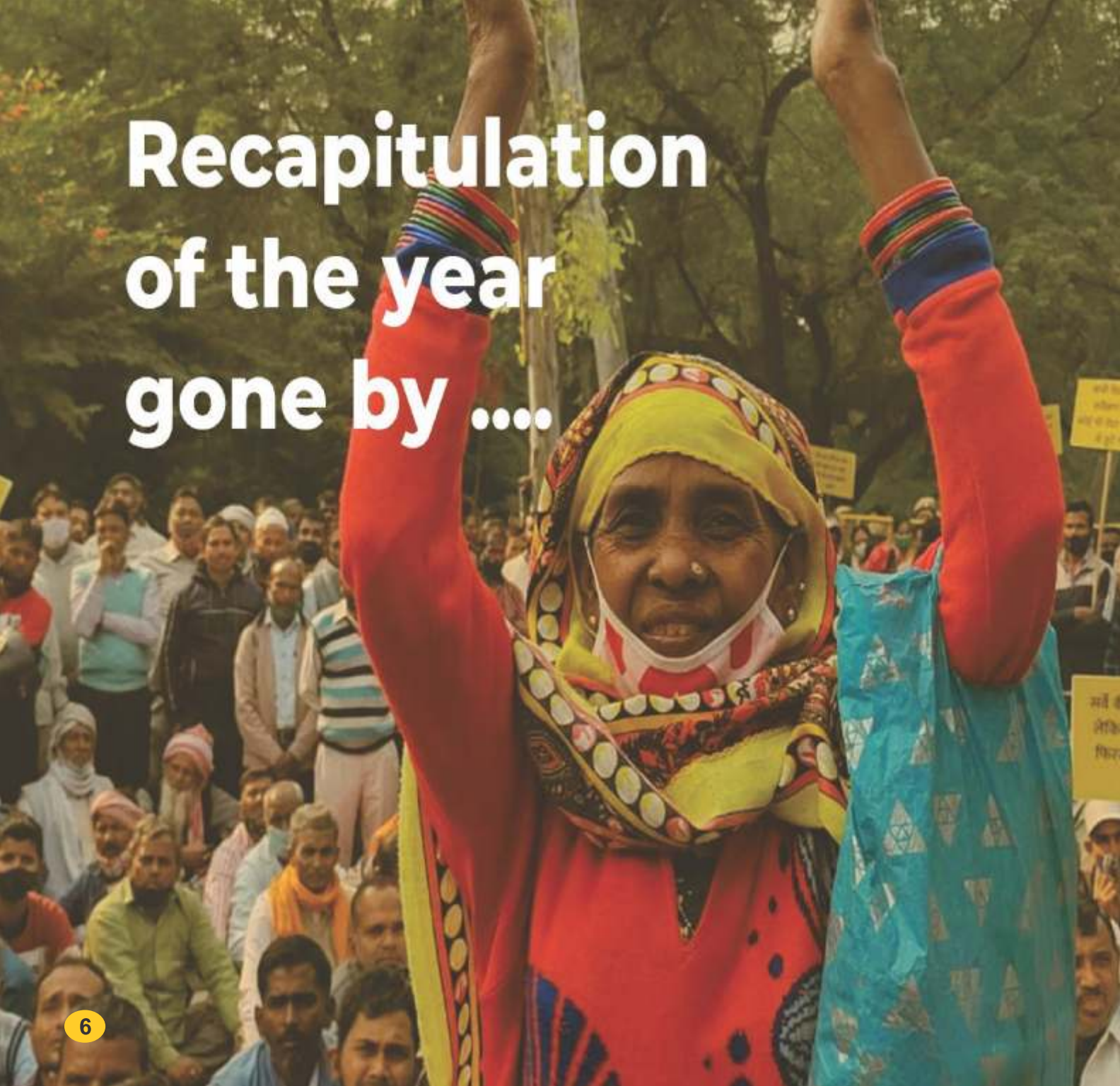
5. Police or any other law enforcement cannot prevent any certified vendors from exercising their rights.

6. Relocation and seizure of goods rules to be framed.

Delhi Riot – February 2020

Riots and violent incidents in North East Delhi resulted in the death of 34 people and 189 people were injured. Violence was reported from multiple areas. Several houses, vehicles, shops, places of worship, scrap market and even a petrol pump were vandalized. Daily wagers and informal workers for whom earning their livelihood is priority were strongly affected.





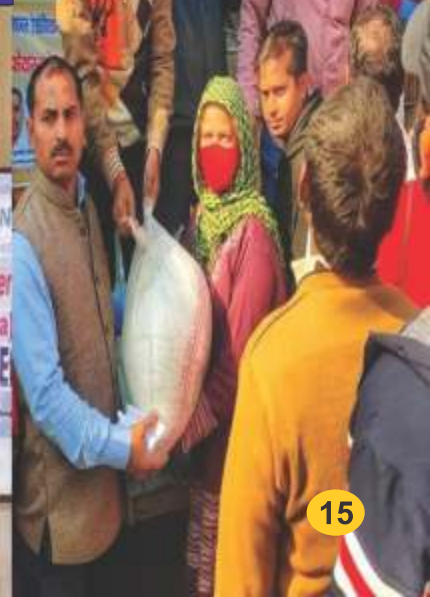
In the aftermath of the riot, NASVI provided dry ration kits, hygiene kits and utensils to over 2000 aggrieved families.


Mission Corona Vijay - NASVI vaccinated 90,000 beneficiaries from across the country against the novel coronavirus in 13 cities - Delhi NCR, Pune, Mumbai, Hyderabad, Bangalore, Chennai, Patna, Muzzafarpur, Bhagalpur, Lucknow, Varanasi, Jamshedpur, Kolkata





Hygiene Kit Distribution - NASVI in association with Dettol distributed masks and soaps to the vendors of the country as they bounced back to carry out their livelihood amidst the pandemic.





Over 259 vendors from across the country were provided direct cash support between Rs. 5000 to 50,000 to tide over the covid pandemic. NASVI ran a campaign called "Help them directly" during this period under which monetary support was extended. BOSCH & PHF were the other two philanthropy partners during this endeavor.

Food Safety & Hygiene Training has been conducted in 22 states & UTs of the country in the past year. This year, 7374 vendors have been successfully trained so far.

TVC meetings are a unique initiative of the Street Vendors Act, 2014 where citizens can partake in their city's management. More than 4000 TVCs have been constituted so far. Helmed by the municipal body, 40% of this multi-stakeholder Committee is formed by street vendors and 10% is earmarked for NGOs working for the vendors.

NASVI's SIXER for Street Vendors during Covid-19

Secured Livelihood

Constitute Grievance Redressal Committee, demarcate Vending Zones, issue Certificates of Vending , stop seizure of goods without receipt, Municipal bodies give list of vendors to Police so as to stop harrasment in name of illegality

PM-SVANidhi Yojna

Link the street vendors with Banks and the credit scheme for economic recovery.

Digital Payment

Link all the street vendors with digital Payment like Googlepay, PhonePe, Paytm, Bhim and other E-wallets and Banks.

Vaccination

Vaccinate all the vendors so that they remain safe from COVID - 19 and link them with CoWin and also take the booster dose

E-Shram Card

The ESHRAM covers unorganised workers and aims to implement social security schemes. Registration on the portal is free of cost

Link with Social Security

like SVANidhi se Samriddhi so that street vendors can avail the benefit of social security schemes.
